## THE VILLAGE CLOCK

On November 19th a new Carrollwood Village landmark was unveiled - the Village Clock, located at the South Village and Dale Mabry entrance. "The idea was originally presented by our Architectural Branding firm," said Carrollwood Village resident Steve Shirley, Chairman of Phase 1 Renovations and Rebranding.

"While on a business trip in Switzerland, We saw that

many of the beautiful villages in the country had a town clock that served as a focal point and source of pride within the community and our board agreed that it would be a wonderful addition to our neighborhood. A clock is very much like a building, there's consistency to it. Business comes and goes and things change but this will be something that anchors the neighborhood for many years."

Standing at 10 and 1/2 feet tall, the clock took 2 years of planning to come to fruition. Lumicron Clocks, a Master Builder, in Grand Rapids, Michigan, custom built the Stemwinder clock for Carrollwood Village. It is operated by GPS satellite for accurate time and uses celestial measurements for sunrise and sunsets. The Clock face weighs approximately 58 pounds and has a polycarbonate dial, copper hands and is LED internally illuminated with a hammered black finish to match the new Village street and stop signs. "We wanted something refined and appropriate for the street; it has a beautiful European quality to it," said Shirley. The clock face and numerals are mathematically calculated to be read from approximately 300 feet.

For hundreds of years, street clocks have created focal points and served as gathering places while offering a sense of community across America. You'll find clocks at thousands of locations, including city streetscapes, public spaces, and community gathering spots. Safety Harbor's downtown has a clock similar in scale to the one in Carrollwood Village and County Staff report that each day they field as many questions about the clock as they do about manatees.


"We've seen beautiful Village and town clocks serving as the pride of other communities," said Shirley. "We're equally proud of where we live so I am happy that we have something as iconic and beautiful. Our residents have been outstanding in their support."

## PUBLIC SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENT TO ALL CARROLLWOOD VILLAGE RESIDENTS!

## HELP REDUCE CRIME IN CARROLLWOOD VILLAGE DOWNLOAD THE NEIGHBORS APP BY RING



The Neighbors App by Ring is working to improve neighborhood watch programs all over the United States. Right here in Carrollwood Village many of your neighbors and friends are already using the Ring App to report suspicious behavior in the neighborhood.

“Hillsborough County Sheriff Chad Chronister is very enthusiastic about Ring and the App,” said Carrollwood Village Phase I HOA Board Member Scott Thomas.

“It’s great because residents can send officers photos or videos of suspected criminals, which is much more valuable than just a description.”

With the Neighbors App, you can also receive real-time crime and safety alerts from your neighbors and local law enforcement for Carrollwood Village. The App is free and easy to use. If you have an iPhone, iPad, iTouch or Android phone, here’s how to download the Neighbors by Ring App.

1. Find the app by going to [Download.Ring.com/CarrollwoodVillage](http://Download.Ring.com/CarrollwoodVillage) through the web browser on your device.
2. Once you’ve downloaded the App, tap “sign up” to create a new account.
3. After you enter your address, it should cover the Carrollwood Village area but if you want to adjust the area you receive alerts for, you can do so in Settings. To open settings to adjust the coverage area and to determine how often you want to receive alerts:
  1. Open the menu in the top left-hand corner (three horizontal lines), go to settings.
  2. Tap Neighborhood Area option.
  3. When the map appears, move the dots on the map with your fingers to adjust the map to the Carrollwood Village area.
  4. Tap Save in the upper right-hand corner to save.

When you have the Neighbors App, you’ll receive a notice on your device whenever someone in Carrollwood Village reports suspicious or criminal behavior. The more residents who sign up for the program, the more effective it will be.

“If every person in Carrollwood Village had this App, imagine how we could keep an eye out for each other,” said Scott.

If you are interested in more personal home security from Ring, they sell video doorbells (it’s kind of like caller ID for your front door), cameras and keypads. You do need a smartphone and Wi-fi to use the doorbell or camera but the products give you the added security of being able to monitor your home from anywhere. 

## BUTTERFLIES AND HUMMINGBIRDS - THEY ARE IN OUR VILLAGE!



Did you know we had hummingbirds and many types of butterflies here in our village? We do! They are a delight to watch with their beautiful colors and in the case of the hummingbirds, their amazing actions. Butterflies are also an indicator species for Earth health. They are very sensitive to many of the chemicals/pollutants that harm us. So let us all help them out!

How do we help the Butterflies and Hummingbirds?

It is surprisingly simple to help our butterfly and hummingbirds (A.K.A. hummers). We only have to plant their food sources. Thankfully many of these high nectar plants are prolific blooming perennials. That makes it easier on us as you only have to plant once to enjoy the long-term beauty.

Plant them and they will come!

In pre-garden times, no butterflies visited the homes on our street. Most residents did not even know hummers were in the area! My neighbors are shocked at the transformation in our small corner of the village. Today we enjoy seeing many types of the colorful winged beauties floating about calming our hearts and bringing smiles to our face! We did not even have all the plants in the ground and the hummers were there darting, hovering, and humming about. Again, this brought big smiles to our faces to be able to watch this treat of nature. This doesn't even account for the beauty of the flowers!

What do I plant?

This treating doesn't bode well for butterflies not matter what they try to tell you with their advertising.

## WHAT TO PLANT IN DECEMBER:



PANSY

**Bedding Plants:** To add color to the winter garden plant masses of petunia, pansy, and snapdragon.

**Bulbs:** Amaryllis is a popular plant for the holiday season. It can be forced to bloom now or planted outdoors for spring blooms. The blooms die it can be planted in a sunny spot and it will bloom next year.

**Herbs:** Plant herbs that thrive in cool weather. Some examples include parsley, thyme, sage, dill, fennel, and cilantro.

**Vegetables:** Reliable cool-season vegetables to plant this month include celery, cauliflower, lettuce, cabbage, and carrot.

### What to Do:

**Poinsettias:** Enjoy one of the most popular indoor holiday plants. Protect it from cold until spring, and then plant it in the garden for next year.

**Cold protection:** Prepare now to protect tender plants should cold weather threaten. Old bedsheets are the best!

**Lawn disease:** Continue to watch for brown patch and large patch, fungal diseases that cause areas of grass to turn brown. Since treatment is difficult, prevention with proper cultural practices is key. These diseases become active when the soil temperature, measured 2–4 in. deep, is between 65°F and 75°F and go dormant when the weather warms in May.

POINSETTIAS:

**Compost/mulch:** Use fallen leaves to provide the carbon ingredient needed for successful composting and also to make good mulch.

**Landscape and garden pests:** Continue monitoring and treat as needed. While cooler weather generally means fewer pests, some populations actually increase at this time of year.




